Creator of the Stars of Night

Jacques Lemmens (1823-1881)

Follow the tune at GTG #84. Lemmens has transformed the freeform chant melody into a rather "regular" hymn tune. Throughout most of the piece (until the last measure) there is one note at a time for each hand, and one note for the pedals, featuring the three softest flute stops on our organ. The linkage of the advent of the Savior with his sovereignty over all creation is an ancient, pithy theological concept worthy of exploration in our time of ecological crisis.






