Four Influences on Lewis and Tolkien's Storytelling

five-week series with Dr. Corrie Greene Wednesdays, 6:00-7:00pm January 10–February 7

week 4 – January 31 Beer, Scarcity, and Sehnsuct

Meeting at least weekly to enjoy beers and banter, Lewis and Tolkien experienced a growing reality of scarcity during and after the end of World War Two. Pivotal in their understanding of Christianity as well as their individual narration of mythologies and middle-earth is the concept of sehnsuct, or "inconsolable longing . . . desire for our own far-off country . . . for something that has never actually appeared in our experience . . ." For our last structured session, we will tangle with how scarcity – making a previously taken for granted resource finite – causes us to hold tightly to those things we value, while at the same time opening our grasp to the unknown.
